### Central tips for citing in term papers

Writing scientific texts always requires proof of facts and evidence.

This is done by footnotes in the text, in which the references are to be mentioned (literature, ancient text sources, etc.).

A citation also serves to distinguish between thoughts and findings of third parties and one's own. The correct citation guarantees the comprehensibility of the argument and protects the intellectual copyright of third parties. Failure to use the correct citation violates scientific ethics (plagiarism!).

A distinction is made between literal (direct) and analogous (indirect) quotations:

Verbatim quotation: Reproduction of a text passage in exact word order Incl. punctuation and spelling

Marking by quotation marks in the text

Quotation: Reproduction of a text passage in own words (paraphrased)

### **ATTENTION:**

This is the most common source of errors when quoting. Rephrased thoughts or translations from foreign languages are also quotations that must be cited!

Work steps for the preparation of a term paper

Topic identification

Schedule and outline

Literature research and editing

The writing process

Formalities / Editing

Proofreading

Delivery

- The basis of the term paper is the presentation.
- Depending on the text length further/other focal points are possible.
- Use the office hours for preliminary discussion of the term paper!

### Components of the term paper

Depending on the module, lengths of 5, 10 or 20 pages are specified (<u>module examinations</u>). This refers to pages of text only.

Cover page, table of contents, bibliography, list of figures and illustrations are to be added. The specified lengths **must not be undercut** and should not be exceeded (max. + 10%).

Attach standard <u>cover for term papers</u>

Title page, if applicable

Table of contents

Text

Introduction: <u>Begins on p. 1</u>

Main part

Conclusion/Result

Bibliography

List of Figures

Figures (with figure captions)

### Table of contents

- ✤ Include all elements except <u>cover page for term paper</u>
- ✤ Reflects the outline of the work
- ✤ Work with hierarchy levels
- Headings in the table of contents = headings in the paper
- Page numbers (except cover page and table of contents)
- ✤ Introduction begins on p. 1

### Formal requirements of the institute

Please follow the layout guidelines for the text pages of the term paper.

Formal: Continuous text

#### Formatting:

Margins: Top: 2.5 cm, Bottom: 2.0 cm,

Left: 3.0 cm, right: 3.0 cm

### Font:

Times New Roman in font size 12 pt

or

Calibri in font size 11 pt

or

Arial in font size 11 pt

**Paragraph**: Justified, with 1.5 line spacing

Footnotes: Font size 10 pt with 1-times line spacing

### Footnotes and bibliography

Create footnotes according to author-year system.

All references are cited in the footnotes only as abbreviated citations and the abbreviation is resolved accordingly in the bibliography. The authors are listed in alphabetical order.



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

# Literature management

✤ Management of literature and citations

♦ Can be integrated into word processing programs (e.g. Word)

- Often have extensions to add literature to the database directly from the internet
- ♦ Often free / discounted for students
- **\*** Caution with automatic creation of bibliographical list.
  - Check: Does the bibliography comply with the citation guidelines?

Especially conference proceedings and/or series will be often not correctly specified!
